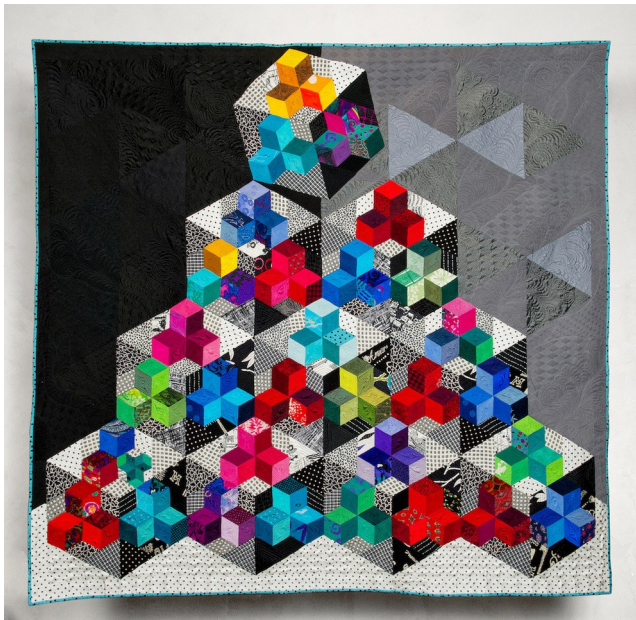

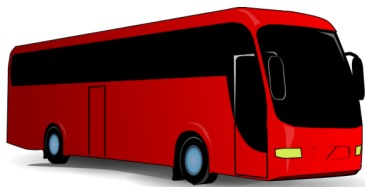
Wenatchee quilts selected for Houston show

You need to be able to move around, hang/take down drapes and quilts, and carry items. Teams move through the arena to set up and take down the quilt show in amazingly short amounts of time. No previous experience is necessary. Bring your spouse, significant other, teenagers, and friends. Bring your step ladder if you're a ladder person! You can pick up the quilts you entered after take down on Saturday.

Seated jobs: Admissions- In the lobby handling money, passing out programs, and greeting visitors Community Booth- In the arena talking to visitors about the guild Raffle Ticket Sales- In the lobby handling money and greeting visitors Silent Demos- In the arena doing personal hand work and talking to visitors

Standing jobs: Artisan Market- On the concourse, handling money and talking to visitors White Gloves- In the arena, walking around and interacting with visitors

A receiving table will be set up in the Avamere sitting room during the above times only for receiving entries. **A receipt will be given for the items received; you must have this receipt to retrieve your quilt after the show.** Fold entries with the right, lower front corner on the top.

Items will not be accepted unless an entry form was submitted by the July 26 deadline.

Items must be dropped off by 6:00 PM on Monday, August 12, to be included in the show.

The following procedures are for your protection. Please honor them.

1. A receipt must be presented in order to pick up each item.
2. Items must be picked up between 5:45 and 6:45 PM, August 17.
3. **No items will leave prior to the stated time, or without a receipt.**
4. No one other than authorized personnel will be allowed into the Quilt Show area while quilts are being prepared for return
5. If you are unable to pick up your quilt, please make arrangements to have someone pick it up for you. (They must have the receipt.) Mailing of items to their owners will not be available.

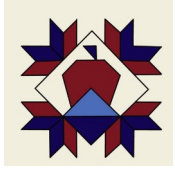
