Dear Quilt Guild Members:

Loosely translated, the German part of our Guild name means happy quilter, the addicted kind of happy. We are a non-profit quilt education organization.

The guild has 27 members, and all are active in presenting the numerous quilt education events to the community, surrounding area and the northwest.

Our biggest event is the annual Spring Fling Quilt Show. With over 150 quilt entries on display, as well as a traveling challenge trunk show (Keepsake Quilting this year), featured northwest quilt artist, Quilting demonstrations and Downtown Quilt Walk, attendees come from all across Washington, Oregon, Idaho, Montana and British Columbia to view the quilts and take in the educational demonstrations. Venders from throughout the area offer the latest quilting fabrics and tools. The Downtown Quilt Walk offers participants the opportunity to view quilts in the local businesses, vote for their favorites and get their passports validated to enter for a prize drawing.

The 3rd Monday of March each year, the Guild sponsors Quilt Til You Wilt, and 18 hour day retreat featuring quilting related demonstrations, quilt theme games, fabric exchanges and show and tell. Last year 97 people pre-registered for this event, each receiving a packet of quilting related items, donated by quilt shops, venders and guilds.

During the Annual Deutschesfest German Festival the 3rd weekend in September, the Guild hosts a display of vintage quilts, in Old St Matthews Church, a part of the Odessa Historical Society Museum. A new display is offered each year, borrowed from the collections of people who have a connection to Odessa. The purpose of this event is to educate people about the value of heirloom quilts, add to the variety of activities at Deutschesfest and share quilting knowledge.

Guild members make quilts to donate to Angel Flight, service organizations and community fund drives.

The 1st Monday in December is the Annual Christmas Party, complete with a no host catered meal, quick quilt education snippets, quilt games, show and tell and usually some type of quilt challenge to be completed by the next Christmas party.

The guild meets each Monday at 1 pm and 7 pm in the Museum Barn library, except major holidays. We plan events, work on Angel Flight quilts, annual raffle quilts and our own projects. Our group is open to all who enjoy quilting.

Dear Abbey: On March 14 you printed a question from "Jim in New Jersey" who asked if brand-new clothing should be washed before wearing. Having worked in a shirt factory for years, let me tell you how many hands handle the shirt before it goes into that neat little bag.

- 1. Someone spreads the fabric and lays the pattern.
- 2. The cutter cuts it.
- 3. Someone else ties the different parts together.
- 4. Another person takes the parts to the sewing people.
- 5. One sewer attaches the pocket to the front.
- 6. Another sews the voke to the back.
- 7. Another sews the back to the front.
- 8. Another sews in the sleeves.
- 9. Another sews the side seams.
- 10. Still another hems the bottom.
- 11. Another adds the collar.
- 12. Another sews on the cuffs (if long sleeved).
- 13. Someone else sews on the buttons.
- 14. Another reinforces the buttonholes.
- 15. An inspector examines the garment for loose threads.
- 16. An auditor gives it a final check.
- 17. And finally, someone folds the shirt and puts it into that nice, clean-looking bag.
