# QUILTS GOING UP ON BARNS ACROSS KITTITAS COUNTY

(Ellensburg) Daily Record

ELLENSBURG — A small nonprofit group has a big, colorful dream: to install large, brightly-painted square panels of quilt blocks on 35 to 40 Kittitas County barns by this spring.

So far, the group has been successful in getting two barn quilts up, each wood panel measuring 4 by 4 or 8 by 8-feet, and a third went up privately in cooperation with the group, said Jacky Fausset of Cle Elum, president of the Barn Quilts of Kittitas County board.

"We have gotten overwhelming positive support for the project from almost everyone who hears about it," said Fausset in emailed comments.

The first quilt artwork went up in early October and will be part of the state's first-ever barn quilt trail, a self-guided tour that, hopefully, will attract tourists, Fausset said. "Barn quilt trails in other counties have been very successful in attracting 'agri-tourists' and having a positive economic impact on local business."

This article was published in the Wenatchee World, October 31st. I'm so excited to see Washington get it's first Quilt Trail! And right in our "backyard". It will be a fun outing to hunt for these blocks on the country roads. Let's create a trail in Chelan County!

We asked Guild members, "Are you working on handmade holiday gifts? Who do you make these for? When did you start?" Several members replied:

Claudía Olson-"I am making towels for my kids, whose kitchen towels look embarrassingly thread-bare. I am making the sort that you buy at Craft Warehouse and add a border strip to. I've finished the fall ones and am now starting the winter ones. I'm also embroidering leaves on one corner of the big square tea towels for them both. They are turning out awesome! I started in September, 'cause these things take time.

Anne Dent-I am making place mat sets for my daughters. I started these last Nov. and didn't get them done in time for last C-mas. LOL I am thinking of making necklaces for my grand daughters, as I just learned wire wrapping. For the boys, I don't know yet LOL. Two of them are Lego ages.

Jill Therriault-Am I working on handmade Holiday Gifts?

Do I breathe Air? Of Course! I am making Garment bagstook the pattern from a plastic one I got years ago from Nordstrom. They are pretty easy, though they do require a very long zipper (I use the continuous one they sell at Joann's), but they use up all kinds of extra quilt binding! And they look nice for traveling. I am always making new table runners with Christmas motifs. This year will include Christmas balls in wool and Holly leaves! On the cooking side; Habenero Jelly, Candied Walnuts and Pumpkin Anything!

Wilma Delp shared this story during our September Guild Show and Tell. This is her Christmas project:



Pillow gift: Finding a gift for older siblings who have everything they need has always been a difficult journey for me. This Christmas my sister and brother will receive a pillow made from our father's wool bathrobe. It was a robe his mother had made for him and my mother had mended many times. We three kids took turns sitting on that scratchy robe sharing Dad's peanuts and sips of beer. Because of its well used condition it was difficult to find useable yardage for three pillows.

I embellished the pillows with small pieces of wool from quilt shops and a wool coat I had found at the Goodwill. Then, using crazy quilt stitches, I embellished the word "HOME" and added a few beads. The back of the pillow has a zippered pocket in which I stuffed old time toys (a paddle with a ball on a long rubber band, jacks, and balsa wood gliders. Also included in the pocket is a short letter of childhood memories and photos of the past.

This project took me several months because I had to search for supplies, decide how to make it, make three pillows and then I had to fit the project around many other projects and classes already in the works. If I were to make one pillow with no interruptions including the beading and crazy stitches, it could be completed in about twenty hours; more or less.

#### **Problem Solved: Thread Catchers!**

Do you find knots of thread at the start of each 1/4 " seam allowance? Jill Therriault taught us a neat trick at the Sew-In to correct this problem. Jill actually solves two dilemmas. We forgot to bring bags to tape next to our machines for thread scraps. Jill said, "You don't need a bag if you use a Thread Catcher" And she tossed a selvedge edge she had just cut over to us-"Here, use this". If you take a small scrap of fabric @3" x 1" and insert it under the needle after you finish your seam, the scrap will save your place, and make the next seam stitch smoothly. No lifting the presser foot, no dragging the threads up to the cutter, no dangling threads on each end to trim. And you'll have clean seams at both ends. And, no messy threads to sweep up. Thanks Jill!


